Complete the form and return it to Bundy Management. Kathy will forward your request to the ACC. The ACC usually reviews submittal forms via email, hence the turnaround time is fairly quick. PLEASE do not allow your contractor to pressure you to proceed without ACC approval as there is a monetary penalty should one choose not to follow the procedure.

Some mailboxes are beginning to look as if they need a new coat of paint. Take a good look at yours. The color is Rust-Oleum brand Hunter Green. Please do not paint over the numbers.

Finally, take a look around your yard for items hidden in the bushes or not stored away properly and remove them to the garage or service area. If we all keep up with this, our neighborhood will look really good.
