Dredging Update The board met this week with the top officials of Estate Management Services and discussed the overall project. Aside from some cleanup and minor restoration efforts, dredging at our lake has come to a close. The project was very successful and the lake's capacity has been returned to well below the county's acceptable level. Overall, the dredging increased the lakes water capacity by approximately 1.8 million gallons. Residents are reminded and encouraged to do their best at reducing litter and debris around the lake for its general upkeep and to help ensure that no further dredging will be needed for many years.

Amenity Update As previously advised, our swimming pool is open with modifications. All residents must sign the waiver in order to have their amenity card activated for pool and restroom use. Please follow the guidelines for pool utilization and social distancing. The tennis courts, bocce ball court, and basketball court remain open. Pavilion utilization remains at limited capacity, no gatherings larger than ten (10). Our fitness center and playground will remain closed until we can comply with the CDC guidelines.

Golf Course News Following a four day closure for golf course aeration, general course maintenance, pro shop and club house maintenance the golf course continues to be in great shape and is experiencing a high volume of play. Also, membership numbers are now up to 85, while last year it was under 10 - great job! The board has also met with resident and the new Head of Agronomy, Mr. Gary Davis, and we're encouraged by the dialogue and recognition of working together cooperatively. Congratulations to all the golf course staff on their continued hard work and dedicated efforts.

Volunteer Summer Irrigation Campaign All residents should have already received correspondence from BJWSA regarding their summer efforts at water conservation and reduced utilization during peak hours. Residents living in even number homes were asked to water lawns on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays while those living in odd numbered homes should water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. Monday was requested to be a no watering day. All efforts are voluntary and residents are reminded that any other efforts to reduce water utilization during potential drought conditions can help all and save some money.

Food Drive The Eagle's Pointe Food Drive was a huge success! Over 150 bags of dry food, along with cash donations, were made by residents and presented to Bluffton Self Help. Residents can feel great that their contributions will help make a difference for some families in need during these very trying times.
